So what happened here? The doctor went in and when he realized he could not move it, he decided he was going to take out these two wire mesh stents. What do you think happened? He could not pull it out as a whole stent. He had to take out wire by wire, and in doing so, literally destroyed the inside of this young man's urethra. Because of the extensive nature of the surgical repair, he had to have massive reconstructive surgery on his penis.

During the time that this patient has to have his penis and his urethra heal, where did the urine go? They had to make an opening between his scrotum and his anus to allow the urine to come out. This otherwise healthy man, now had to go to the bathroom sitting down every single time in order for him to urinate.
